Publications and Presentations

- Two books on research-based interventions for autism in 2011 and 2013, with a third under contract for 2023. Total sales of the 2011 volume and individual chapters has exceeded 70,000.
- More than a dozen peer-reviewed articles in scientific journals and a dozen chapters in scientific volumes since 1981
- More than 30 invited presentations to state, national, and international organizations
- More than 75 papers presented at state, national, and international conferences since 1995

Specific highlights in the field of autism

- Co-authored the first training guide for the Checklist for Autism in Toddlers (CHAT) and became the first site in North America to implement it. The CHAT is the precursor to the most commonly used screening instrument for autism in the world
- Co-authored an early version of the Early Social Communication Scales, one of the most frequently used observation measures of joint attention and social interaction in children with autism
- Invited to <u>review 40 years of research</u> for the leading autism research journal, and to summarize advances in policy in the <u>Handbook of Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders</u>, the book most widely cited by researchers in the feild of autism for the past 3 decades

Specific highlights in the field of conservation and outdoor recreation

- As a founding member of the Council on Inclusive Health and Disability of the Land Trust Alliance, I co-authored the Open to All: A disability inclusion resource guide for land trusts in 2021. This is used by land trusts nationwide, and has been the focus of presentations and workshops across the country.
- I developed Progressive Access, a framework that begins to integrate trail design, adaptive outdoor recreation, and new technologies with research-based intervention approaches to build the capacity of people with disabilities to access a greater range of

paths, trails, and routes for both active transportation purposes and recreation. Elements of this framework have now been incorporated into guidelines used by trail designers nationwide, <u>Universal Access Trails and Shared Use Paths: Guidance for Accessibility and Inclusive Design</u>. I am now working with a wheelchair athlete recently featured on <u>PBS Newshour</u> on a trail rating system that helps users with disabilities evaluate whether existing paths are appropriate for them. We are beginning to roll these out for shared use paths through <u>Kennett Outdoors</u> (see below).

Advocacy

- Founded Fix66, successfully lobbying Pennsylvania lawmakers for an additional year of public school to mitigate Covid's impact on the education of 21 year-old youths in special education. Act 55 signed by Governor Wolf on July 8, 3002, is projected to have benefitted at least 1200 youths by redirecting up to \$50M dollars of federal pandemic relief funding.
- Founded OpenKennett, a forum to encourage advocates on local issues. We predicted ballooning municipal expenses that led to 20% tax increases, revealed potential conflicts of interests leading to an independent ethics review, and won multiple appeals on Right to Know requests exposing government waste and mismanagement.
- Founded <u>KennettOutdoors</u>, a forum to encourage the use and development of the full range of paths, routes, and trails in our region, with a special focus on infrastructure and practices to support recreation and active transportation for people with disabilities
- Founded the <u>Kennett Ability Network</u>, a coalition seeking to increase opportunities for work, recreation, and community engagement for young adults with disabilities. We have already expanded the <u>YMCA's adaptive programs</u> in our region to include monthly respite-recreation nights at the Kennett Branch, and have grant applications in development to expand this.
